#### PLASTIC AND METALS PACKAGING



#### Uses the Yellow colour container or bag assigned to you

#### **PLASTIC**

- Disposable plastic dishes and glasses provided that they are properly cleaned and free from organic material
- Bottles of water, soft drinks, oil, juices, milk, etc...
- Tea brick, bottles of detergents, soaps, various products
- Tubes for creams, sauces, syrups, straws, etc...
- Rigid packages for desserts in plastic or polystyrene, transparent boxes, rigid/flexible packages for foodstuffs in general (cold cuts, cheeses, fresh pasta, etc...)
- Food trays (eggs, ice cream, etc...)
- Containers for yoghurt, cream cheese, dessert
- Bag nests for fruit and vegetables
- Containers for various products packaging (cosmetics, wet wipes, powdered products)
- Pots for plants (maximum diameter 15/20 cm)
- Envelopes and bags for food in general (pasta, rice, potato crisps, sweets, snacks, etc.)
- Sacks, bags, envelopes in general (shopping)
- Small plastic from packaging (bottles, toilet paper packaging, etc...)
- Polystyrene (if large, reduce the size)

#### **METALS**

- Food boxes and cans (tuna, meat, vegetables, pet food, etc...)
- Aluminium cans
- · Empty paint cans
- Steel or aluminium caps or covers
- Aluminium trays for food (not too dirty)
- Aluminium tubes (mayonnaise, creams, etc.)
- Nails, screws, iron wires and metallic materials of small size from domestic maintenance

Do you have medium/large size metal objects that you do not know where to dispose of?



Example: pans, bins, drums, nets, shelves, etc...

The large objects in steel, aluminium or iron can be recovered and recycled bringing them at the Municipal Collection Centres.



#### Remove food residues!

Plastic should not be washed, but in the case of very dirty packaging/containers, it is good to simply rinse them and make sure that there are no food residues that could cause unpleasant odours.



**Crushes the plastic bottles** and screw the cap to **reduce their volume**

#### PAPER AND CARDBOARD



#### Uses the **Blue Colour** container assigned to you

- Newspapers and magazines
- Brochures and flyers
- · Old exercise books
- Paper bags
- · Tetra Pak
- Cardboard packaging and boxes
- Pizza boxes
   (if not too dirty)
- Paper tablecloths



#### **Break the boxes!**

Crush and fold the cardboard boxes, in order to reduce the volume.



## The plastic bag is not paper!

If collect paper at home inside *plastic bags*, clear the contents inside the **blue container** and dispose of the plastic bag into the container for plastic.

#### Remove food residues!

The glass must not be washed, but it is a good practice to simply rinse it and make sure that there are no residues of food or liquids.

#### **ORGANIC WASTE**



Use the **Brown Colour** container assigned to you

- Fruit and vegetables waste
- Meat and fish in small pieces
- Dairy products
- Egg shells
- · Leaves and soil
- Animal excrements
- Tea/coffee or other herbal tea grounds
- Paper napkins or handkerchiefs
- Sawdust and ash wood (off and wrapped)
- Absorbent kitchen paper (even wet or greasy)

#### **NO** pads



Dispose them of in the container for the **Dry Residue Waste** or **Dedicated service** 

### Close the bag well!

Dispose of waste after having correctly insert them in Biodegradable and/or Compostable bags.

#### **NO Plastic Bags**



Dispose of **Organic Waste** inside Biodegradable bags avoiding **plastic bags** 



#### HOME COMPOSTING

Composter | 300 L Usable by anyone with at least 150 sqm of land (gardens, orchards, etc...)

## Inside the compost heap should be disposed of the following wastes:

- Kitchen waste, leftovers, spoiled food (remove from the packages)
- Fruit and vegetables waste (including the woody parts, e.g. dry fruit)
- Coffee grounds and tea and chamomile filters
- Cut flowers, wilted plants, leaf and grass clippings
- · Stale or mouldy bread
- Domestic meat and fish waste (including fish bones, egg shells, bones, feathers, etc.)

#### **DRY RESIDUE WASTE**



# Uses the **Dark Grey** colour container assigned to you



Dry Residue Waste <u>does not mean that</u> <u>you can mix the waste</u> avoiding doing waste sorting!

In this container you can dispose of only those waste that cannot be differentiated and not those who do not want to differentiate.

#### As for example:

- · Nappies, incontinence pads and under pads
- Sanitary napkins
- Plastic cutlery
- Clothes hangers, rubber and plastics toys
- · Coffee capsules made of hard plastic
- CDs, DVDs, music cassettes and video cassettes
- Objects in ceramics, porcelain, Pyrex glass and glass-ceramic
- Powders from vacuum cleaner or house rubbish
- · X-rays, photographic films and slides
- Incandescent lamps
- · Pens, felt pens and stationery in general
- · Toothbrushes and sponges

- Greaseproof paper, plasticised and thermal paper (receipts, faxes, etc...)
- Baking paper, dirty paper and wet wipes
- Tights and stockings
- Cigarette butts (off)
- · Carpets, cloths, fabrics and clothing fallen into disuse
- Irrigation pipes
- Mirrors and crystal
- · Cups made of glass



#### Close the bag well!

Dispose of waste after having correctly insert them into the bags!

## **Municipal Collection Centre**

**WHAT IS IT?** The collection centres are the natural completion of the differentiated waste collection service, giving the public a solution to recycle all those waste which, for size or type, may not be delivered in the containers provided for home use.

**HOW TO DO IT?** In order to be able to deliver in all the 5 collection centres of the Municipality of Perugia, it is necessary to hold the magnetic card "AMICARD", which can be obtained free of charge at the collection centre, by filling out a simple form.

#### WHAT CAN YOU TAKE?

Iron, Plastic, steel and aluminium Cans, Paper and cardboard, Glass, WEEE (All electrical and electronic materials), Car batteries, Exhausted batteries, Mineral Oil, Used clothing, Bulky, Wood, Paints, Acids, Pesticides, Spray cans, Expired drugs, Inert, Grass cuttings and pruning, Large plastics.

## Where do I dispose of **vegetable oil?**Do not discard it in the sink! Use Olly!



#### USE OLLY COLLECTION

**CENTRES:** Olly is the innovative system for the recovery of vegetable exhausted oils. The Collection Centres allow users via the Amicard card, to take a free container for oil collection and once filled, to take it back to the centre.

WHICH OIL CAN YOU DISCARD? Inside Olly containers you can discard all vegetable oils, such as frying oil and pickles' oil.

## WHAT WASTE CAN YOU DISPOSE OF IN THE CONTAINERS?

The containers are used for the collection of small electrical and electronic waste, such as: battery chargers, hair-dryers, smart phones, remote controls, power supplies, mp3 players, etc...

#### Do you have bulky waste to discard?

Just take your handset! Free call... Free collection.

Dispose of your bulky waste is **easy and free**, thanks to the collection service on request.

#### How to do it?

You can book the service by contacting the Gest Customer Service Office (contact numbers at the bottom of the page).

#### How and when is the collection?

The Customer Service Office indicates the date of collection and the previous evening the user must place the bulky waste outside his house.

#### What can you dispose?

Bulky waste such as: cupboards, sofas, mattresses, armchairs, chairs, desks... or WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) such as refrigerators, monitors, televisions, washing machines, water heaters...

# Free collection service Nappies and Incontinence padsfor babies, elderly and patients.



First of all it is important to remember that nappies and incontinence pads are normally dispose of in the Grey container dedicated to the Dry Residue Waste.

Collection Incontinence pads In addition to the normal collection service, families in difficulties that have to dispose of a considerable number of nappies and/or incontinence pads, may take advantage of the free additional collection dedicated to this type of waste. Users who register to the service will receive the appropriate bags that will be collected by the assigned operators once a week.
